"It's really scary and something we haven't had to deal with before because of the Internet's positive nature. We're going to be dealing with it in the future as hackers become more sophisticated." Once hackers take someone's personal information, the scope of what they can do with it is almost limitless. Last year, a couple who bought a \$300 laptop online were shocked to find that the device was brimming with intimate photos and videos of a female friend the couple had hired to take pictures in their home.
